At-a-Glance Overview of Key Improvements:

Streamlined Downloading

- now a simple, guided, 3-stage process for users
- better device compatibility
- auto detects user's current device and alters options contextually
- utilizes Adobe Digital Editions and Bluefire exclusively; past ebrary app no longer required

Better Print/Copy Functionality

- user's remaining amounts for printing/copying now displayed prominently
- information visible at multiple points throughout reading experience
- balances tracked by user login
- ability to select from five different citation styles when printing to .PDF

Improved Bibliographic Information Display

- MARC-like list of bibliographic details displayed on title's landing page, including subject headings and call numbers

Font Clarity and Enhanced Customization of Text Size

- more user options for increasing the legibility of text and improving the overall online reading experience
- consistent reader display across different types of devices

Greater Customization of Notes and Annotations

- persistent overhead toolbar for quick access to highlighting, etc.
- increased flexibility for the selection and annotation of text; allows for users to adjust the reader to fit their research preferences, not the other way around

COMMON QUESTIONS

Q: Does my institution have perpetual access to this content?

A: No, our consortial arrangement for Academic Complete is subscription based, so continued access is contingent upon annual renewal from all participating Orbis-Cascade members.

Q: How many titles are included?

A: As of 11-21-14, there are 113,839 titles in Academic Complete.

Q: What are the publication dates of the included titles?

A: The vast majority are 1995-2014, with a smaller number going back to the early 20th century.

Q: Are extra funds required from my institution on top of the existing annual DDA contribution?

A: No, subscription fees for Academic Complete are being taken from the same pool of funds.

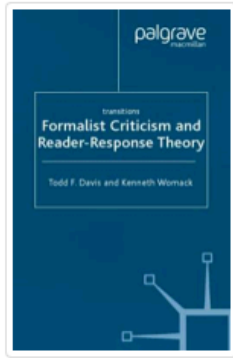

GETTING STARTED - A quick intro

The New Online Reader and Creating an Account

The new version of Ebrary's Reader interface has consolidated functionality onto the main landing page for a given title. There are two ways for users to access an AC ebook: *Read Online* or *Download* (the blue buttons on the left lead to the same place as the ones under "Availability".) It also clearly states the remaining print and copy balances for the user.

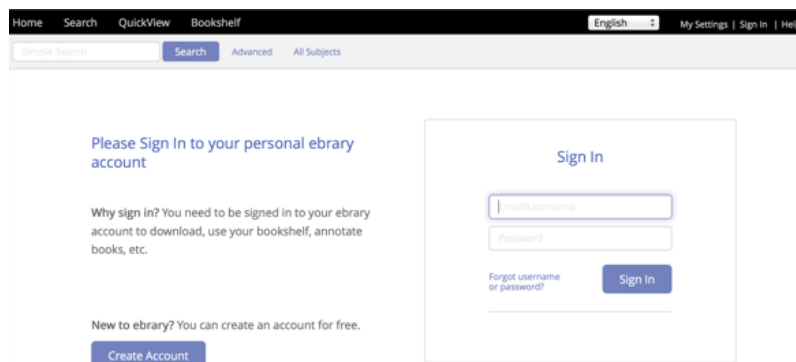
LIBRARY HOLDINGS

 Subscription

Print and Copy balances are connected to a user's Ebrary account. To create an account, go to "Sign In" on the upper right and click the "Create an Account" button, and follow the steps.



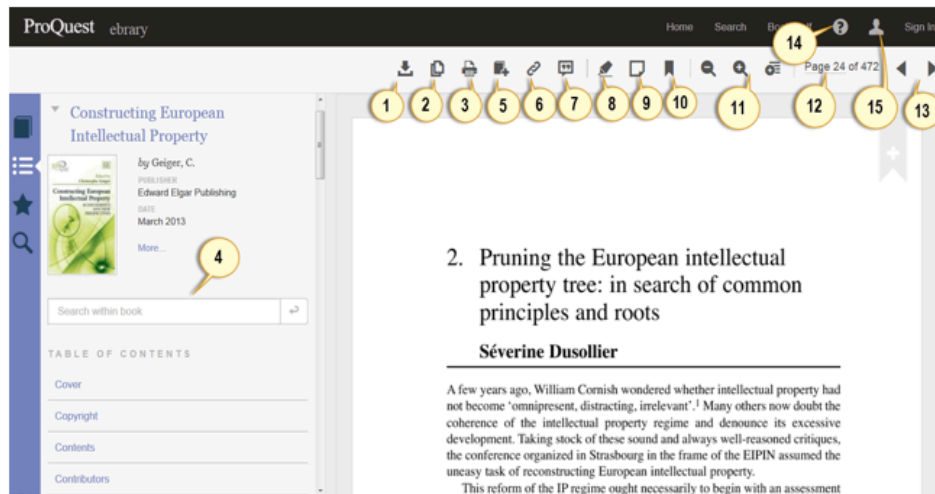
NOTE: User accounts are necessary to access full functionality, such as annotating, highlighting and creating personal bookshelves. "Sign In" leads to an account creation page if the user does not have one already.



After creating an account you can:

- Save documents, notes, and highlights to your personal bookshelf
- Add books to your bookshelf to save for future use
- Create folders to organize your research
- Download pages or entire e-book

Selecting "Read Online" takes you into the new interface. The icons above the main viewer window control all of the added functionality available to the user after sign-in. The book is searchable full-text on the left, and the Table of Contents is browseable.

Selecting "Download" takes you to a 3-step process for downloading the title onto computer or device. If a user initiates the process, Academic Complete will automatically detect computer/laptop or mobile device and alter the contextual options presented to the user accordingly. *NOTE: Downloading to a computer requires Adobe Digital Editions and a registered Adobe account and user name. Downloading to a mobile device requires Bluefire. Ebrary's own reader app has been discontinued with the launch of the new revamped AC interface.*

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



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
